Incorporated in 1851 and named for William A. Graham, governor of North Carolina from 1845 to 1849, Graham is the seat of county government and second largest city in Alamance County. A diversified economic base includes companies involved in textiles, plastics, electronics and metalworking. The city is proud of its architectural heritage, which features several well-preserved examples of the Victorian style. Graham has an active arts and culture scene that includes stage productions by local theater companies, art galleries, and the annual Arts Around the Square. The North Carolina Symphony also performs two local concerts annually.
